BIRDS

GEESE, SWANS & DUCKS Anatidae

Greylag Goose Anser anser

Widespread on the short grass meadows in the highlands and along the coast in the Western Isles. 200/9

Canada Goose Branta canadensis

Small flocks on Mull and along the western coast. 25/5

Mute Swan Cygnus olor

A few around the western coast. 2/4

Whooper Swan Cygnus cygnus

One, unexpected, on Loch Poit Nah-L near Fionnphort. 1/1

Common Shelduck Tadorna tadorna

A few seen on the Yathan Estuary in the Highlands and on Mull and Skye. 4/6

Eurasian Wigeon Anas penelope

2 in a flooded field pond near the Broomhill Bridge, not far from Nethybridge. 2/1

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

Widespread, seen daily. 10/14

Common Teal Anas crecca

Small groups seen in a couple of spots in the Highlands and on the Ardnamurchan Peninsula. 5/3

Tufted Duck Aythya fuligula

A number on Loch Shiel and Loch Laide. 10/3

King Eider Somateria spectabilis

A drake amongst the Common Eiders on the Ythan Estuary, that has been there for many years! 1/1

Common Eider Somateria mollissima

Hundreds on the Ytahn Estuary and widespread on the western isles and coast. 300/7

Common Goldeneye Bucephala clangula

A female in Nethybridge, and 3 on the River Spey at the Broomhill Bridge. 3/3

Goosander (Common Merganser) Mergus merganser merganser

This is the nominate race, that is sometimes considered a separate species from a*mercianus* the North American race known at Common Merganser. The differences are subtle, with a more hooked bill, a curved upper culmen which gives it a thin looking bill in particular in the middle, and lack of a short narrow black wing bar on the folded wing. Seen on Mull and Loch Sunart. 2/2

Red-breasted Merganser Mergus serrator

Seen in small numbers on most days in the Western Isles and on west coast. 3/7

PARTRIDGES & PHEASANTS Phasianidae

Red-legged Partridge Alectoris rufa

A few scattered in the Highlands and one on Ardnamurchan. 6/5

Common (Ring-necked) Pheasant Phasianus colchicus

Common in farmland, edges of moor and woods in the highlands, and a couple on Mull and Muck. 12/7

Western (Eurasian) Capercaillie Tetrao urogallus

A female with chick partially hidden in the blaeberry in the Highland pine forest. 1/1

Black Grouse Tetrao tetrix

1 non displaying male at the lek on the Highland moor at Dorback. 1/1

Willow Grouse "Red Grouse" Lagopus lagopus scotica

This is the famous red grouse of whisky fame! Endemic to the British Isles, this subspecies *scotica* is often considered a separate species since it retains its rusty plumage all year round, while the nominate race has a white belly and wings and goes all white in winter. Great views on the heather moors at Dava Moor adjacent to Lochindorb. 6/2

(Rock) Ptarmigan Lagopus mutus

One seen exceptional well sitting on the snow fence near the Cairngorm top station. 2/1

LOONS Gaviidae

Red-throated Diver (Loon) Gavia stellata

One or two seen on most days in the west as well as on Loch Laide. 2/7

Black-throated Diver (Arctic Loon) Gavia arctica

A pair seen well on Lochindorb. 2/1

GREBES Podicipedidae

Little Grebe Tachybaptus ruficollis

Our only sighting of an adult on Loch Scridain on Mull. 1/1

Horned (Slavonian) Grebe Podiceps auritus

A pair in the highlands on Loch Laide. 2/1

FULMARS & SHEARWATERS Procellariidae

Northern Fulmar Fulmarus glacialis

Seen well gliding effortless along the cliff face at Troup Head, Staffa, Lunga and at Staffin on Skye. 20/3

Manx Shearwater Puffinus puffinus

A few on the way to Treshnish Isles and Muck, off of Ardnamurchan Lighthouse, with best views on the Mallaig to Armadale (Skye) ferry. 30/4

GANNETS Sulidae

Gannet Morus bassanus

Close views from the boat at the Troup Head nest colony, and a few off the Western Isles. 4000/8

CORMORANTS & SHAGS Phalacrocoracidae

Great Cormorant Phalocrocorax carbo

Seen in good numbers at Troup Head, and on the Western Isles. 50/7

European Shaq Phalacrocorax aristotellis

Common at Troup Head, and at Lunga and Eigg in the Inner Hebrides. 22/8

BITTERNS, HERONS & EGRETS Ardeidae

Grey Heron Ardea cinerea

A few in the Highlands and far more common in the Western Isles. 12/13

OSPREY Pandionidae

Osprey Pandion haliaetus

The big successs story for the RSPB and a Scottish icon! In 1916 the last remaing osprey in the UK was shot. After almost 40 years a pair returned to Loch Garten in 1954 and nests successfully! There are now over 250 pairs in the UK! Unfortunately something happened to male (Odin) as he was not seen after mid May and the female (EJ) was left without a mate this season! Our lone Osprey sighting was one going over the Cairngorm Plateau! 1/1

KITES, HAWKS & EAGLES Accipitridae

Golden Eagle Aquila chrysaetos

A few individuals on Mull and the Ardnamurchan Peninsula. 3/3

Hen (Northern) Harrier Circus cyaneus cyaneus

This is the nominate race, that is recognized by some authorities as a separate species from the North American Northern Harrier *hudsonius*. It differs by being overall lighter in both sexes, while the males have more extensive black on the tips of the five outer primaries and less tail-barring, while the female does not have the rufous colouration that Northern does. A male was seen flying past us at Loch Scridain as we were watching an otter, with another more distant sighting on Mull, and one at we were leaving Eigg. 1/3

Eurasian Sparrowhawk Accipiter nisus

One on Mull, the remainder all seen in the Highlands. 3/4

Red Kite Milvus milvus

After becoming extinct in England in 1871 and the last one seen in Scotland in 1879, by the mid-1930's only 20 remained in the UK, those being in Wales. As one of the longest running conservation projects, begun in 1903, 93 Red Kites were re-introduced to the Black Isles in 1989 (as well as the Chilterns). In 1992 the first wild born chick

in Scotland fledged. There are now over 2000 breeding pairs. One seen briefly in the Strathdearn, and three circling close to us on the Black Isle. 3/2

White-tailed Eagle Haliaeetus albicilla

Also known as Sea Eagle it is the largest bird of prey in the UK. Having gone extinct in the UK by 1918, due to illegal hunting, they were successfully re-introduced from Norwegian stock to the Western Isles in the mid-1970's. After more than 70 years the first successfully fledglings (on Mull) occured in 1985. Following another west coast re-introduction in the mid-1990's the population has expanded and there are now over 65 territorities. Good sightings on Mull and the Ardnamurchan Peninsula. 3/4

Common Buzzard Buteo buteo

Widespread with a few seen almost daily. 3/12

RAILS, CRAKES & COOTS Rallidae

Corncrake Crex crex

Up to half a dozen heard on Muck, including one tantalizingly close! h/1

OYSTERCATCHERS Haematopus ostralegus

Eurasian Oystercatcher Haematopus ostralegus

Common and widespread with their loud piping call is a common sound of meadows, rocky coastlines and beaches. 40/13

PLOVERS & LAPWINGS Charadriidae

Northern Lapwing Vanellus vanellus

Common and widespread in meadows and farmland in particular in the Highlands, some with chicks. 12/11

Common Ringed Plover Charadrius hiaticula

A few pairs seen on sandy beaches mostly on the Western Isles. 4/5

Eurasian Dotterel Charadrius morinellus

Incredible views of two confiding pairs on the Cairgorm Plateau. 4/1

SANDPIPERS Scolopacidae

Common Sandpiper Acititis hypoleucos

The most common sandpiper. Frequently seen along the shoreline of lochs. 8/12

Common Greenshank Tringa nebularia

Singles on Loch Na Keal (Mull) and Loch Sligachan (Skye). 1/2

Common Redshank Tringa totanus

A couple along Strathdearn, one at Lochindorb, a few on Mull. 4/5

Eurasian Curlew Numenius arquata

Widespread in small numbers on heather moors and meadows, displaying and with chicks. 8/9

Dunlin Calidris alpina

Two at the Ythan Estuary. 2/1

Common Snipe Gallinago gallinago

One near Broomhill Bridge in the Highlands, and one or two on most days in the Western Isles. 2/8

JAEGERS & SKUAS Stercorariidae

Great Skua Stercorarius skua

A single bird at Lunga in the Treshnish Isles and off of Eigg; several pairs seen well at Staffin Island on Skye. 6/3

Parasitic Jaeger (Arctic Skua) Stercorarius parasiticus

A single dark morph bird seen off of Ardnamuchan Lighthouse. 1/1

ALCIDS (AUKS) Alcidae

Common Murre (Guillemot) Uria aalge

The most common auk breeding at Troup Head; some seen on the way to the Treshnish Isles and Eigg. 1000/3

Razorbill Alca torda

Seen in small numbers than Murres in the same locations. 200/4

Black Guillemot Cepphus grylle

A few pairs off of Troup Head, and scattered along Western Isles coastline. 9/7

Atlantic Puffin Fratercula arctica

A handfull in the water at Troup Head, with wonderful close views of hundreds nesting on Lunga. 600/3 GULLS & TERNS Laridae

Black-legged Kittiwake Rissa tridactyla

Many pairs nesting on Troup Head and Lunga in the Treshnish Isles. 1000/3

Black-headed Gull Chroicocephalus ridibundus

Common and widespread especially around urban areas in the Highlands. 50/11

Common Gull Larus canus canus

This is the nominate race *canus*, that is found in Western Europe. Widespread. The most common gull on the trip, seen daily. The American subspecies (*L. c. brachyrhynchus*) found along the Pacific coast, Alaska and Western Canada is known as Mew Gull. 200/14

Herring Gull Larus argentatus argenteus

This is the British race argenteus which is common and widespread especially along the coasts. 1000/11

Iceland Gull Larus glaucoides

A late staying second cycle bird that Toby found amongst the Common and Herring Gulls at the Deveron River mouth. 1/1

Lesser Black-backed Gull Larus fuscus graellsii

A few scattered in the Highlands and on Mull. 12/6

Greater Black-backed Gull Larus marinus

Seen along the coasts in small numbers, with the on the Troup Head boat ride. 3/11

Little Tern Sterna albifrons

Half a dozen included close views at the Ythan Estuary. 6/1

Common Tern Sterna hirundo

A few scattered in the Highlands which most being seen on Loch Linnie. 20/1

Arctic Tern Sterna paradisaea

Many on the Troup Head boat ride, with a few around Eigg and Muck. 120/4

Sandwich Tern Sterna sandvicensis

Only seen off the Deveron Estuary and on the Troup Head boat ride. 50/1

PIGEONS & DOVES Columbidae

Rock Dove (Feral Pigeon) Columba livia

Surprisingly not seen in the Highlands! Seen around the Western coast. 20/6

Common Woodpigeon Columba palumbus

Widespread and common in the Highlands and a few seen in the Western Isles. 20/10

Eurasian Collared Dove Streptopelia decaocto

Widespread in small numbers, seen daily. 4/14

OLD WORLD CUCKOOS Cuculidae

Common Cuckoo Cuculus canorus

Single birds heard only at Loch Garten and Glen Borrowdale on the Ardnamurchan Peninsula. 1/2

OWLS Strigidae

Short-eared Owl Asio flammeus

Incredible look at a wet one sitting on a fence post beside the road in Glen More on Mull. 1/1

SWIFTS Apodidae

Common Swift Apus apus

Small numbers nesting in Nethybridge and seen on Skye. 12/8

WOODPECKERS Picidae

Great Spotted Woodpecker Dendrocopos major

Seen a few times in the Highlands, including good views at Loch Garten and Redcastle, also on Mull. 2/6 FALCONS Falconidae

Eurasian (Common) Kestrel Falco tinnunculus

A few seen in the Highlands and on Mull. 2/6

Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus

Wonderful showing of one going after a couple of Herring Gulls over Eigg harbour. 1/1

CROWS & JAYS Corvidae

Eurasian Jay Garrulus glandarius

A brief look at one at Dell Woods in the Abernethy Forest

Eurasian (Common) Magpie Pica pica

A few in the fields east of MacDuff in Aberdeenshire. 4/1

Eurasian (Western) Jackdaw Corvus monedula

Abundant in the Highlands, common on Mull and scattered elsewhere in the west. 40/9

Rook Corvus frugileaus

Common in short grass pastures and farmland, with most seen in the Highlands and a few on Mull. 60.6

Carrion Crow Corvus corone

A few seen near the Moray coast in the Highlands. 6/3

Hooded Crow Corvus cornix

Split from Carrion Crow and elevated to full species in 2002. Only seen in the Western Isles, where it is common and where it replaces the Carrion Crow. 25/9

Common Raven Corvus corax

A small flock on the Cairngorms, and seen daily in the Western Isles in small numbers. 7/10

LARKS Alaudidae

(Common) Skylark Alauda arvensis

Widespread in small numbers across grasslands and moors, seen daily on the Western Isles. 4/10

SWALLOWS Hirundinidae

Sand Martin (Bank Swallow) Riparia riparia

Widespread and common. 14/12

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica

Widespread in small numbers, seen daily. 10/14

(Common) House Martin Delichon urbica

Widespread and common. Nesting under the eaves at the Mountview Hotel. 20/12

TITS Paridae

Coal Tit Parus ater

Common in the Highlands and on Mull, a few elsewhere. 8/8

Crested Tit Parus cristatus

Wonderful views of adult and young at the feeders in Dell Woods in the Abernethy Forest. 2/3

(Eurasian) Blue Tit Parus caeruleus

Scattered in small numbers. 4/9

Great Tit Parus major

Scattered in the Highlands with a few on Mull. 5/5

BUSHTITS Aegithalidae

Long-tailed Tit Aegithalos caudatus

Three moving through the trees at the Glenforsa on Mull. 3/1

TREECREEPERS Certhiidae

(Eurasian) Treecreeper Certhia familiaris

Seen in the Carrbridge Woods and at Loch Garten. 3/2

WRENS Troglodytidae

(Eurasian) Wren Troglodytes troglodytes

Seen or heard on most days. 3/13

DIPPERS Cinclidae

(White-throated) Dipper Cinclus cinclus

One coming to a nest under the Broomhill Bridge. 1/3

GOLDCRESTS & KINGLETS Regulidae

Goldcrest Regulus regulus

Heard and one seen in the Abernethy Forest. 1/2

LEAF WARBLERS & ALLIES Phylloscopidae

Willow Warbler Phylloscopus trochilus

Common, heard or seen every day. 8/14

(Common) Chiffchaff Phylloscopus collybita

Ony one heard at Urquhart Castle. 1/1

Wood Warbler Phylloscopus sibilatrix

Two seen well at Craigellachie, and one heard on Skye. 2/2

REED WARBLERS & Allies Acrocephalidae

Sedge Warbler Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

One on the way to the Troup Head ferry at MacDuff. 1/1

WARBLERS Sylviidae

(Eurasian) Blackcap Sylvia atricapilla

Heard, but never seen, on Mull, Ardnamurchan and Urquhart Castle. h/5

Greater (Common) Whitethroat Sylvia communis

Singles on Mull. 1/2

CHATS & OLD WORLD FLYCATCHERS Muscicapidae

Spotted Flycatcher Muscicapa striata

Seen well in the Highlands at Craigellachie, Loch Garten and Abernethy Forest, a few on the west coast. 5/6

European Robin Erithacus rubecula

A couple seen almost daily. 4/12

(European) Pied Flycatcher Ficedula hypoleuca

A male seen near to its nest box at Craigellachie. 1/1

Common Redstart Phoenicurus phoenicurus

Great views of a singing male at Loch Garten, and in the Abernethy Forest. 2/2

Whinchat Saxicola rubetra

Good looks at a couple on Mull and Skye. 2/4

European (Common) Stonechat Saxicola rubicola

Seen in small numbers on most days in the Western Isles. 4/6

Northern Wheatear Oenanthe oenanthe

Only seen on the Western Isles where it was common. 8/6

THRUSHES Turdidae

Ring Ouzel Turdus torquatus

Three near the beginning of he walk up to the Cairngorm Plateau. 3/1

Common Blackbird Turdus merula

Abundant, seen daily. 10/14

Song Thrush Turdus philomelos

Widespread and common in small numbers. 4/13

Mistle Thrush Turdus viscivorus

Common in the Highalnds and a few scattered in the Western Isles. 6/9

STARLINGS Sturnidae

Common Starling Sturnus vulgaris

Common in the Western Isles and around towns in the Highlands. 12/11

ACCENTORS Prunellidae

Dunnock Prunella modularis

A couple in the Highlands, on Mull and Skye. 2/8

WAGTAILS & PIPITS Motacillidae

Grey Wagtail Motacilla cinerea

Singles along the Strathdearn and Spey Rivers in the Highlands, on Mull and a pair on Skye. 2/4

Pied Wagtail Motacilla alba yarrellii

Common, seen daily. The race found in Britain is *yarrellii*, in which the male has a **black** back and flanks, while the female is dark grey, hence the name Pied. 10/14

Meadow Pipit Anthus pratensis

The most common songbird on the moors and grasslands. Seen daily. 20/14

Tree Pipit Anthus trivialis

A couple seen in the Aberthnethy Forest. 2/2

Rock Pipit Anthus petrosus

Seen daily in the Western Isles along rocky coastlines. 3/8

BUNTINGS & ALLIES Emberizidae

Yellowhammer Emberiza citrinella

Seen around the farm fields along Moray Coast, in Aberdeenshire and on Skye. 4/3

Reed Bunting Emberiza schoeniclus

A surprise sighting along the edge shoreline of Lochindorb in the Highlands, and a couple on Ardnamurchan. 2/4

Corn Bunting Emberiza calandra

A few around the farm and grasslands in Aberdeenshire. 5/1

FINCHES Fringillidae

Common Chaffinch Fringilla coelebs

Abundant. The most common finch, seen daily. 30/14

Eurasian Bullfinch Pyrrhula pyrrhula

Brief looks at a couple in the Abernethey Forest. 2/2

European Greenfinch Carduelis chloris

A few scattered. This seems to be a finch in decline, 8/9

Red (Common) Crossbill Loxia curvirostra

A couple flew over in the Abernethy Forest, calling as they went. h/1

Common (Lesser) Redpoll Carduelis flammea cabaret

The British have split this smaller and darker European resident *cabaret*, and called it Lesser, from the widespread North American Common Redpoll *flammea* which they call Mealy! There is a possibility that recent studies will prove that all redpolls are in fact one species! Heard at Dorback in the Highlands, and seen most days in the Western Isles. 8/6

Eurasian Siskin Carduelis spinus

The most common and widespread of the Carduelis finches, often seen at feeders. 10/12

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis

Scattered in small numbers, with the most being seen in a field near the Black Isle. 20/7

Twite Carduelis flavirostris

A couple on Mull, Ardnamurchan and Skye. 2/3

Eurasian (Common) Linnet Carduelis cannabina

Scattered in small numbers. 6/6

OLD WORLD SPARROWS Passeridae

House Sparrow Passer domesticus

Common around habitations. Seen daily. 10/14

Eurasian Tree Sparrow Passer montanus

A single bird at a feeder near the Black Isle in the Highlands. 1/1

MAMMALS

LAGOMORPHS Lagomorpha

European Hare Lepus europaeus

A few around moorland and farm fields in the Highlands. 4/3

Mountain Hare Lepus timidus

2 in the moorlands at Dorback; great views of 3 as we climbed the Cairngorm. Now with its summer coat! 3/2

Rabbit Oryctolagus cuniculus

Widespread in short grass around habitation. 6/14

CARNIVORES Carnivora

Pine Martin Martes martes

Wonderful views of 2 that came to the feeding station at Bolloch on Movern. 2/1

Eurasian Otter Lutra lutra

Individuals seen on Mull including a wonderful experience with one one an island at Loch Scridain, and 3 near the Skye Bridge at Kyleakin. 7/2

SEALS Pinnipedia

Grey (Atlantic) Seal Halichoerus grypus

Seen along the coast on the Troup Head boat ride as well as the rocky shorelines of the western Isles. 20/3

Harbour (Common) Seal Phoca vitulina

Seen along the coast as well as the rocky shorelines of the western Isles with many off the north end of Muck. 80/6

WHALES & DOLPHINS Cetacea

Northern Minke Whale Balaenoptera acutorostrata

Great views of 2 on the boat between Eigg and Muck, and 1 seen from the Ardnamurchan Lighthouse. 2/2

Common Bottle-nosed Dolphin Tursiops truncatus

One briefly on the Troup Head boat ride. 1/1

Harbour Porpoise Phocoena phocoena

2 on the boat ride to Eigg and Muck. 2/1

EVEN-TOED UNGULATES Artiodactyla

Red Deer Cervus elephus

Common and widespread in the Western Isles. 28/5

Roe Deer Capreolus capreolus

A few seen in grasslands surrounding woodlands in the highlands. 3/6

Reindeer Rangifer tarandus

A herd was first re-introduced to the Highlands in 1952. 5 at the base of the Cairngorms. 5/1

RODENTS Rodentia

Red Squirrel Sciurus vulgaris

A couple seen in the Abernethy Forest in the Highlands. 2/3

Bank Vole Clethrionomys glareolus

Several at the base of the feeders at the Loch Garten's Osprey Center in the Abernethy Forest, and 1 on Morvern scrurrying across the road. 3/2

Wood Mouse Apodemus sylvaticus

1 at the Pine Martin feeding station at Bolloch on Movern. 1/1

AMPHIBIANS & REPTILES

LIZARDS & SNAKES Squamata

Viviparous Lizard Lacerta vivipara

1 seen by Marcia on her walk between Salen by Aros and the Glenforsa Hotel. 1/1

Slow Worm Anguis fragilis

A pair along Loch Laggan when we stopped to view Ardvirkie Castle. 2/1

DRAGONFLIES Anisoptera

Golden-ringed Dragonfly Cordulegaster boltonii

A great look at the Natural History Museum on the Ardnamuchan Peninsula. 2/1

Four-spotted Chaser Libellula quadrimaculata

Several over the rushes on a pond at Crigellachie in the Highlands. 4/1

Black Darter Sympetrum danae

1 on the Ardnamuchan Peninsula. 1/1

DAMSELFLIES Zygoptera

Beautiful Demoiselle Calopteryx virgo

An uncommon sighting of 1 on the Ardnamurchan Peninsula. 1/1

Large Red Damselfly Pyrrhosoma nymphula

2 on the Ardnamurchan Peninsula. 2/1

BUTTERFLIES

WHITES & YELLOWS Pieridae

Green-veined White Pieris napi

The most common butterfly we saw, seen in the Highlands, Mull and Skye. 7/4

BLUES, COPPERS & HAIRSTREAKS Lycaenidae

Common Blue Polyommatus icarus

Seen on the western portion of the trip at Ardnamurchan Lighthouse. 3/1

BRUSHFOOTS Nymphalidae

Red Admiral Vanessa atalanta

Singles in the Highalnds and at the Ardnamurchan Lighthouse. 1/3

Small Tortoiseshell Aglais urticae

A couple of flyby's in the Highalnds. 2/2

Small Pearl-bordered Fritillary Boloria selene

Seen at the Ardnamurchan Lighthouse. 2/1

SATYRS Satyridae

Meadow Brown Maniola jurtina

One at Acharacle in a garden patch while looking at orchids. 1/1

Small Heath Coenonympha pamphilus

A few on the Ardnamurchan Peninsula and one on Muck. 3/2

SWIFT MOTHS Hepialidae

Ghost Moth Hepialus humuli

At Phil's croft on Skye

Gold Swift Phymatopus hecta

At Phil's croft on Skye

Map-winged Swift Korscheltellus fusconebulosa

At Phil's croft on Skye

EGGAR MOTHS Lasiocampidae

Northern Eggar Lasiocampa quercus

A small number flying on the Ardnamurchan Peninsula east of the lighthouse

Drinker Euthrix potatoria

At Phil's croft on Skye

EMPEROR MOTHS Saturniidae

Emperor Moth Saturnia pavonia

One in flight near Loch Na Keal on Mull

HOOK-TIPS Drepanidae

Scalloped Hook-tip Falcaria lacertinaria

At Phil's croft on Skye

Pebble Hook-tip Saturnia pavonia

At Phil's croft on Skye

FALSE OWLET MOTHS Thyatiridae

Peach Blossom Thyatira batis

One in the foyer at the Lock Shiels Hotel and at Phil's croft on Skye

EMERALDS Geometrinae
